Isaiah 61:3 - Jesus takes away the bondage of past failures and disappointments.

Exodus 34:6 - The Lord came to extend mercy, forgiveness, goodness, and truth.

Ezekiel 11:19

- Jesus came to give us a new heart and new spirit.

- Jesus came to transform our minds and our thinking.

- Jesus came to change our focus from the flesh to the Spirit.

- Jesus came to rescue us from death and give us eternal life.

John 3:7 - Jesus came to give us a New Birth.

Matthew 1:21 - Jesus came to save us from our sins.

John 1:29 - Jesus came to take away the sin of the world.

John 4:23, 24

- Jesus came to lead us to worship Him in Spirit and in Truth.

Luke 22:42

- Jesus came to teach us to do the Father's Will not ours.

- Jesus came to prepare us for a new heaven and new earth.

THE CHANGES THAT WE NEED

Isaiah 1:16 - Put away the evil that we have practiced.

Proverbs 4:24 - Change our deceitful ways and our perverse talking.

1 Corinthians 13:11 - Put away childish things.

Ephesians 4:31 - Get rid of wrath, anger, outbursts, evil speaking, and malice.
 1 Peter 2:1 - Lay aside, deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and evil speaking.

Hebrews 12:1 - Lay aside everything that hinders and the sins that easily bind us.

THE CHANGES THAT ARE MADE

Psalms 51:10 - We need Divine aid to create in us a clean heart and a right spirit.

Romans 3:24 - We are justified freely and redeemed by the grace of Jesus.

1 Corinthians 1:30 - We are righteous and redeemed only through Jesus.

Galatians 2:16 - We are justified by faith in Jesus alone.

Philippians 4:13 - We can accomplish all things through Jesus.

John 15:5, 6 - We can't make any changes without Jesus.

John 15:7 - Only as we abide in Jesus can the changes be made.

John 1:12 - Those that accept Jesus receive the power to make the change.

James 2:24 - Our works confirm that we are justified by faith.

THE METHOD BY WHICH THESE CHANGES ARE MADE

Titus 2:11 - The grace of God that brings salvation is available to everyone.

- We are saved by grace through faith and not by our own works.

- Jesus carried our sins so that we could become His righteousness.

Romans 3:24, 25 - Jesus became the payment and the Substitute for our sins.

Romans 4:6, 7 - Jesus forgave our iniquities and covered our sins with His shed blood.

Romans 5:1 - By grace through faith in Jesus we are at peace with God.

Romans 5:6-10 - We have been reconciled to God through Jesus and saved by His life.

Galatians 2:20 - It is no longer us who live but Christ who lives in us.
